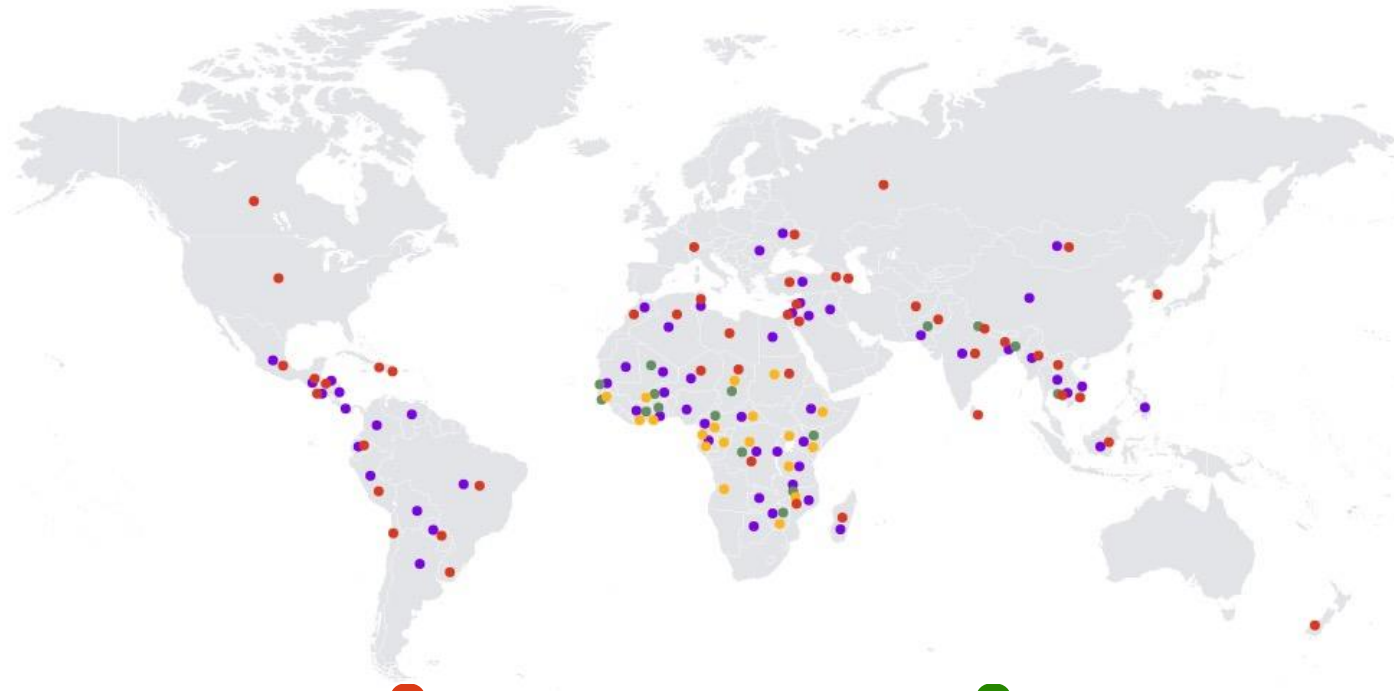

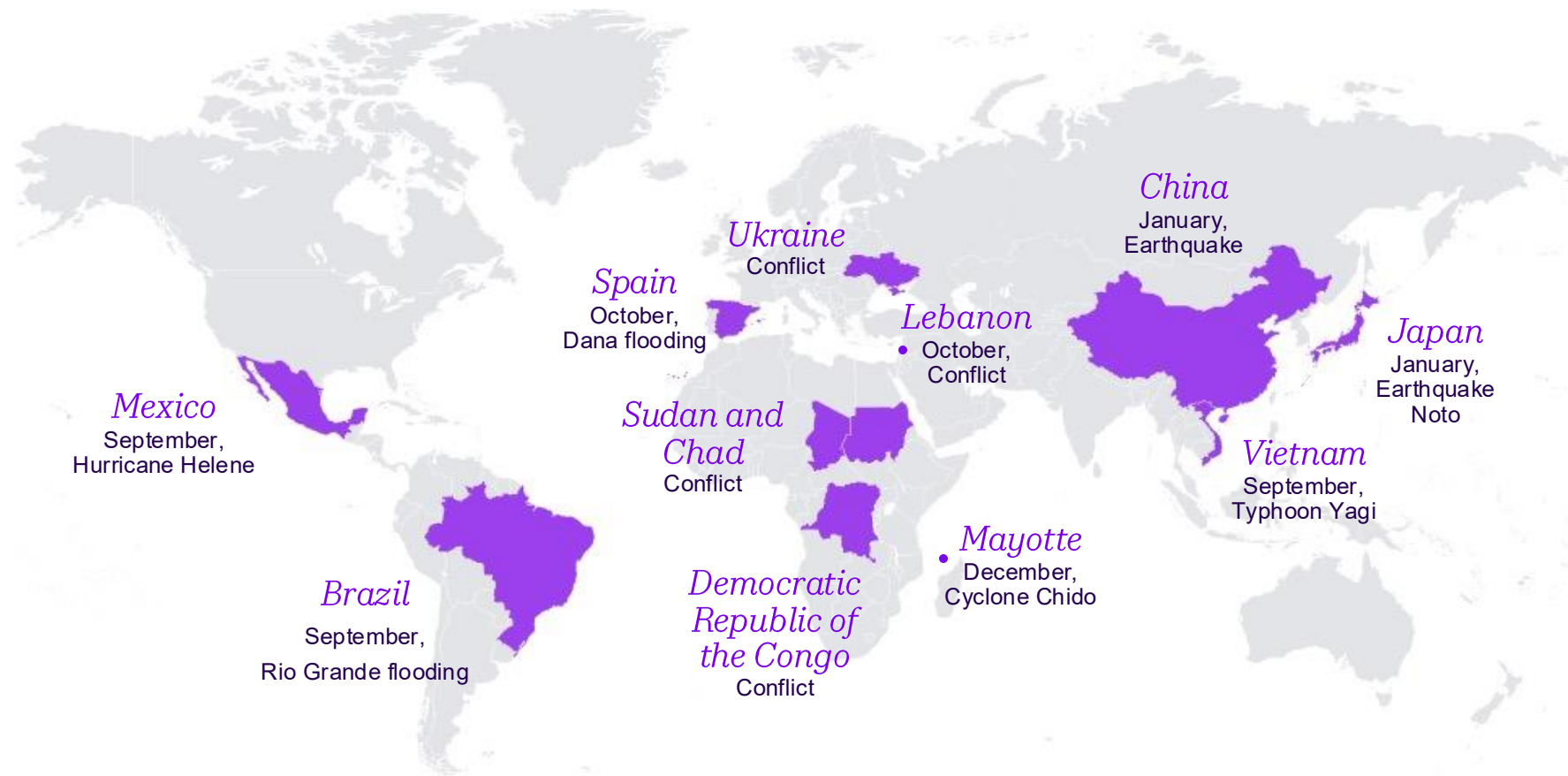

Our Rare Commitment

Patients with rare diseases in under-resourced communities often lack access to life-saving healthcare. Our mission is to provide rare disease treatment access regardless of geography, background, economic resources – across diseases including hemophilia, Gaucher, Fabry disease, Pompe disease, acid sphingomyelinase deficiency (ASMD), and mucopolysaccharidoses (MPS) types I and II.

Our Rare Commitment

→ Hemophilia

Over the past decade, Sanofi and Sobi have **donated one billion international units** (IU of treatment products) to the World Federation of Hemophilia Humanitarian Aid Program, **helping over 22,000 individuals with inherited bleeding disorders**, expanding treatment availability and transforming patient outcomes. **In 2024, we marked 10 years of this partnership** – the largest single donation of hemophilia factor therapy in history. In 2025, we have extended this commitment through a renewed partnership.

→ Gaucher

In 2024, we marked **the 25th Anniversary of The Gaucher Initiative**. Since its inception in 1999, the Gaucher Initiative, in collaboration with Sanofi and Project HOPE, has transformed the landscape of Gaucher disease management in Egypt. **Hundreds of patients have received treatment free of cost**, and our efforts have significantly enhanced the capacity of the Egyptian healthcare system to diagnose and manage this rare disease effectively. We are determined to continue contributing to a

Sleeping sickness, a deadly disease spread by the tsetse fly, continues to threaten lives in Sub-Saharan Africa. Foundation S is contributing to WHO's goal of full elimination by 2030, to end patient suffering.



Thanks to improved monitoring and treatment options, **cases have dropped by 98% since 2001**, and elimination is on the horizon. But complex treatment delivery remains a challenge in underserved communities.



Through long-standing partnerships with the WHO and DNDi, we have been on a journey to revolutionize treatment options and donate these lifesaving drugs to **200,000 patients in need, including 583 in 2024**. This includes the development of **Fexinidazole**, the first multi-dose all-oral treatment co-developed with DNDi, which revolutionized treatment outcomes and simplified delivery.

Neglected Tropical Diseases



In 2024, the WHO designated Fexinidazole Sanofi full multi dose oral treatment as the **first-choice treatment** for the acute form of sleeping sickness disease, expanding its approval to treat an additional strain of the disease. This marks a significant advancement for patients, having so far only very limited therapeutic options and requiring hospital administration under strict supervision.



As we look ahead, our goal is to continue to advance the approval of **Acoziborole** - a **first-of-its-kind, single-dose oral treatment poised to enable a groundbreaking test-and-treat approach**. If approved, it could be the game-changing treatment we need to succeed in full elimination.

Climate Action and Health Resilience

Climate change is the **greatest health threat of our time**, putting over 3.3 billion people at risk. By 2050, it could claim 14.5 million more lives— that's one every minute. Foundation S is building climate-resilient health systems by partnering with local communities, tapping into their expertise, and driving targeted investment where it's needed most.



2024 marked the launch of our [Local Solutions Campus Africa](#), a first of its kind event that brought together **200 frontline actors from 17 African countries** in Dakar to share innovative solutions, all focused on spearheading local action for climate adaptation and health resilience.



In 2024, we announced a **\$1 million contribution to the Green Climate Fund's** USD\$37 million project to increase health resilience of 8 districts in Southern Malawi, along with the Government of Malawi, Save the Children, and other partners.



In 2025, together with the Global Fund and Gates Foundation, we look forward to launching a **US\$50 million Climate and Health Catalytic Fund** to drive action at the intersection of climate and global health.

The Collective MindS Council



Through our think tank, **The Collective MindS Climate x Health Council**, in partnership with the Africa-Europe Foundation, we bring together leading voices from industry, academia, civil society, philanthropy, and government. United by a shared commitment, we drive collective action to strengthen health resilience in the face of the climate crisis.



In 2024, The Collective MindS Climate x Health Council focused specifically on the implementation of the COP 28 Guiding Principles for Financing Climate and Health Solutions and worked to identify mechanisms to ensure **finance reaches climate vulnerable communities to strengthen local health resilience**.



At the UN General Assembly, we held a high-level event with **Foreign Policy to launch a [report](#)** outlining concrete steps on how to adapt to the health impacts of climate change, strengthen the resilience of healthcare systems and protect lives by facilitating rapid, flexible funding for locally led health adaptation.



We also issued an [open letter](#) – calling on those with the power to prevent lives being lost to the climate crisis to act now.

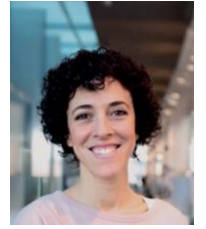

My Child Matters

Every Three Minutes, a Child Dies of Cancer



Each year, **an estimated 400,000 children and adolescents develop cancer**. We are dedicated to transforming childhood cancer care by taking a collective, holistic approach and working alongside local health systems, NGOs, and regional and international stakeholders to adapt resources and drive maximum impact.



Home Away From Home

The 'Home Away From Home' initiative by **Childhood Cancer International** and **Foundation S** helps reduce treatment abandonment by providing safe, nearby housing for young cancer patients and their caregivers. **Since early 2024, three CCI member organizations have expanded their capacity—through a new house purchase, a new build, and operational support for an existing home—to offer essential accommodation and services close to care.**

My Child Matters Expert Committee



Our Childhood Cancer Expert Committee is a diverse, high-level international group of pediatric oncologists, nurses, caregivers, and global health specialists, who guide the strategic direction of the MCM program and play a key role in its annual funding cycle. Through this, Foundation S launched **21 initiatives in 2024** – building the capacity of communities to improve childhood cancer outcomes.

Publications



We published **59 scientific publications** in 2024, supporting evidence-based programming. This contributes to our [Open Data Platform](#), enabling researchers, healthcare professionals, families, institutions, communities, and non-governmental organizations to access critical data for better care and outcomes.
